Workshop:

Thursday, August 3, 10 AM PARC Campus

We will use Amy's Gulls Quilt Pattern to learn to foundation paper piece with efficiency. She will teach her low waste technical approach to paper piecing and discuss its other benefits as well, as it relates to keeping the fabric on grain and prints directional. If you are new to foundation paper



piecing, you will pick this technique up quickly! If you are well versed in FPP, this will likely be a new approach for you so it might feel counterintuitive but it will add a new skill to your FPP toolbox once mastered. We will also discuss modern quilt design, particularly improv paper piecing and deconstruction.

LOOKING AHEAD

Sept – Kevin Womack

Kevin will present a lecture about "Color Theory". Have you ever looked at a color wheel and felt confused? Are you unsure when choosing colors for your projects? Join me on my personal journey of color exploration to help demystify the process. Just why did I choose those colors for that quilt? Do those colors really go together? Learn the answers as we discuss technical terms and see over 40 quilt examples that demonstrate nine different color theories.

Seeing how colors combine and dance across the surface of a quilt fascinates him. He hopes to instill this love of color play in you and leave you inspired to step out of your comfort zone to try new and exciting color combinations for your quilts.

Workshop with Kevin:

Geli Plate Monoprinting

In this fun, process-oriented workshop, explore ways of monoprinting on cloth using gelatin and/or a Gelli Plate. Create complex textural imagery by playing with found objects and fabric paint. With use, the gelatin will break down, producing even more wonderful texture in the results. I will provide the paint and introduce several methods of producing prints with my tools. You supply the fabric and let your imagination run wild. Come prepared to have fun, get messy and be seduced by the silky-smooth surface of a gelatin plate!

We will have for distribution at the August meeting (please help us if you can):

4 sewn quilt tops, backing and batting – to be quilted – longarm or domestic machine 4 kits for sewing – blocks or tops to complete We are currently:

- Collecting 6-1/2" squares of quilt shop quality fabric patriotic or solids preferred.
- Setting up workshop days where you bring your machine and sew blocks for veteran quilts.
- Besides the annual sewing day, we are working on setting up weekly sew days probably Thursday or Friday at a library room either in Downingtown (room for 4 or 5) or near Allentown (room for 6-8)

Let me know if you might be interested in sewing at either of these locations – expected to be in October and/or November on a trial basis. Kits will be pre-cut. All fabric provided.







Want
