Happy New Year 2024! Time to reserve your sewing space now!

Thanks to all of you for your support of our veteran's quilt committee in 2023 and our efforts to have a quilt available to each resident in the Coatesville VA Hospital section for residential living during 2024. We need at least 126 quilts - no smaller than 45" x 60". Most are approximately 60" x 72".

To help us reach our goal, the Emmaus PA Public Library (11 E Main St, Emmaus PA) will provide free sewing space to our registered participants. We have space for 10-12 sewers - 2 people per 10' table - in each session. These quilts are an expression of our thanks for services rendered by the veteran and his or her family and are much appreciated by the recipients.

Kits will be cut out and available to sew during each session or you can take one to complete at home. We will be making blocks to complete the top for at least 1 quilt in each session. We will need Longarm quilters for the tops when they are completed and have a couple of people who have volunteered to finish bindings. Any help you can provide will be much appreciated. Please let me know as soon as you have a chance how you can help and which work session or sessions you will attend.

Bring a sewing machine in good working order that you know how to use, be able to accurately sew a 1/4" seam and bring usual sewing supplies. Fabric, kits, samples and directions will all be provided. We will have irons and ironing boards available and someone to press seams as you progress. Bring a drink. If you sign up for 2 sessions on the same day, please bring a snack or lunch.

If you will car pool, please make sure that I know who is riding together so I can make sure you get your selected sessions. Listing 1st, 2nd and 3rd choices will be helpful.

Modern Swarm


#### PLEASE NOTE THERE IS A NEW MEETING ID AND PASSCODE FOR 2024.
