Flying Geese – Four at once

The height is always half of the width in Flying Geese. With this method, you can make any size Flying Geese with no waste. Add 1 1/4 inches to the desired width, and cut a square. For the sky add 7/8 inch, and cut 4 squares.

Finished size of Flying Geese

- 2" = cut 1 sq. 3 1/4" and 4 sky squares 1 7/8"
- 3" = cut 1 sq. 4 1/4" and 4 sky squares 2 3/8"
- 4" = cut 1 sq. 5 1/4" and 4 sky squares 2 7/8"
- 5" = cut 1 sq. 6 1/4" and 4 sky squares 3 3/8"
- 6" = cut 1 sq. 7 1/4" and 4 sky squares 3 7/8"

On the wrong side of the four small squares, draw a line 1/4" on each side of the diagonal line from corner to corner. With the large square right side up, place two small squares in opposite corners, aligning the edges to the large square. Sew the parallel lines. Cut apart from corner to corner and press open.

On these two pieces, align the remaining squares. Sew both lines, being careful to begin or end your stitch at the "V" point. Check your alignment before cutting apart.
